### Christmas at Emmanuel

The heart of Emmanuel's Christmas Eve celebration is the unique way the Gospel is proclaimed. Instead of simply reading the story of the birth of Jesus from Luke's Gospel and preaching a sermon, the story and stanzas from the great Carols of Christmas are combined to allow the music to do the interpreting of the story. (And no one has ever complained to the Rector about not hearing a sermon!) All three of our Christmas Eve services will feature this presentation.

All Services will also include Holy Communion. Starting 4 December 2022, Emmanuel has returned to the "common cup" for the sacrament, reviving the customary pre-COVID practice. Please note that, though the science deems it safe to sip from a chalice, you are free to receive only the wafer if you prefer.

- Christmas Eve at 5:00 PM Emmanuel welcomes back our Third Saturday Band for their first service since Christmas of 2019. Their guitars, keyboard, drums, and vocals provide a spirited take on both the traditional and contemporary music of the season. This has become the most popular service, so you might think about coming a little early.
- Christmas Eve at 7:30 PM Brent Pertusio, Emmanuel's Organist and Choir Director, leads the musical offerings for this service from our Möller/Luley organ and our vintage Steinway piano. It is every bit the traditional service that people have come to appreciate over the years.
- Christmas Eve at 11:00 PM Our organist and choir lead a service which has evolved to a more intimate celebration of the birth of our Savior, taking advantage of the stillness of late night to allow for moments of prayerful silence.
- Christmas Morning at 10:15 AM If late Christmas eve is silent, so too is Christmas morning. Informal, quiet, and inviting, this service features no music, but rather an original Christmas Morning Story by the Rector. - ❖ New Years Day at 10:15 Like Christmas morning, there will be only one service this Sunday. January 1<sup>st</sup> is a Holy Day The Feast of the Holy Name of Jesus.


## Outreach Stories
